This training block includes an overview of the YES program. A parent's perspective is included.

Background of YES Information on the history of the Jeff D. lawsuit and implementation plan as well as who is involved in building out the YES program.

System of Care The system of care is a comprehensive network of community-based services and supports organized to meet the needs of families who are involved with multiple child service agencies, such as child welfare, mental health, schools, juvenile justice, and health care.

Principles of Care This training focuses on the 11 principles that guide child-serving agencies during the delivery and management of mental health services and supports in the YES program.

Practice Model Learn about the Practice Model, which describes the expected experience of care in the six practice components provide to children and youth in the YES program.

CANS Assessment Tool Introduction to the Child and Adolescent Needs and Strengths (CANS) Assessment Tool.

Person-Centered Plan Introduction to the person-centered problem-solving approach.

Child and Family Team (CFT): Introduction to the teaming process that brings together the youth, family, and individuals they believe can help them develop a plan and achieve their goals.

Wraparound Learn about this intensive, holistic method of engaging with youth who have complex needs and their families so they can live in their homes and communities and realize their goals.

Access Model Learn about the procedures for how YES program members can expect to move into, through and out of Idaho's children's mental health system.

Practice Manual *Introduction to Youth Services guide* is the first in a series of documents intended to provide information about Idaho's system of care and the philosophies behind the program as it will look starting in July 2018. This document will evolve into the Practice Manual.
